

## MEDAEO TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF PURCHASE

### 1 Interpretation

11 In these Conditions, the following definitions apply:  
‘BUSINESS DAY’ a day (other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday) when banks in London are open for business. ‘CONDITIONS’ the terms and conditions set out in this document as amended from time to time in accordance with clause 15.6. ‘CONTRACT’ the contract between the Customer and the Supplier for the sale and purchase of the Goods in accordance with these Conditions.  
‘CUSTOMER’ LuxPak Ltd, trading as MEDAEO of Innovation House, Bakewell Road, Orton Southgate, Peterborough, United Kingdom PE2 6XU (Company Number: 09432228). ‘GOODS’ the goods (or any part of them) set out in the Order. ‘INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS’ all patents, rights to inventions, utility models, copyright and related rights, trade marks, service marks, trade, business and domain names, rights in trade dress or get-ups, rights in goodwill or to sue for passing off, unfair competition rights, rights in designs, artwork, rights in computer software, database right, topography rights, rights in confidential information (including know-how and trade secrets) and any other intellectual property rights, in each case whether registered or unregistered and including all applications for, and renewals or extensions of, such rights, and all similar or equivalent rights or forms of protection in any part of the world.  
‘ORDER’ the Customer’s order for the Goods, as set in the Customer’s purchase order form, the Customer’s written acceptance of the Supplier’s quotation, or overleaf, as the case may be. ‘Specification any specification for the Goods, including any related plans and drawings, that is agreed in writing by the Customer and the Supplier. ‘SUPPLIER’ the person or firm from whom the Customer purchases the Goods.

### 2 Rules of interpretation

21 In these Conditions, unless the context requires otherwise, the following rules apply:  
2.11 A person includes a natural person, corporate or unincorporated body (whether or not having separate legal personality).  
2.12 A reference to a party includes its personal representatives, successors or permitted assignings.  
2.13 A reference to a statute or statutory provision is a reference to such statute or provision as amended or re-enacted. A reference to a statute or statutory provision includes any subordinate legislation made under that statute or statutory provision, as amended or re-enacted.  
2.14 Any phrase introduced by the terms including, include, in particular or any similar expression shall be construed as illustrative and shall not limit the sense of the words preceding those terms.  
2.15 A reference to writing or written includes faxes and e-mails.

### 3 Basis of contract

31 These Conditions apply to the Contract to the exclusion of any other terms that the Supplier seeks to impose or incorporate, or which are implied by trade, custom, practice or course of dealing.  
3.11 The Order constitutes an offer by the Customer to purchase the Goods in accordance with these Conditions.  
3.12 The Order shall be deemed to be accepted on the order of:  
3.13 The Supplier issuing a written acceptance of the Order; and  
3.14 The Supplier doing any act consistent with fulfilling the Order, at which point the Contract shall come into existence.

### 4 The goods

41 The Supplier shall ensure and warrants that the Goods shall:  
4.11 correspond with their description and any applicable Specification;  
4.12 be of satisfactory quality (within the meaning of the Sale of Goods Act 1979, as amended) and fit for any purpose held out by the Supplier or made known to the Supplier by the Customer expressly or by implication, and in this respect the Customer relies on the Supplier’s skill and judgement;  
4.13 be free from defects in design, material and workmanship and remain so for 60 months after delivery; and  
4.14 comply with all applicable statutory and regulatory requirements relating to the manufacture, labelling, packaging, storage, handling and delivery of the Goods.  
4.2 Each of the warranties in condition 31 is separate and is given in addition to all warranties, conditions and other terms implied by statute or common law (including without limitation the conditions implied by section 12 of the Sale of Goods Act 1979 or section 2(3) of the Supply of Goods and Services Act 1982, whichever Act applies to the Contract) which the parties acknowledge are incorporated into the Contract.

4.3 The Supplier shall ensure that at all times it has and maintains all the licences, permissions, authorisations, consents and permits that it needs to carry out its obligations under the Contract.

4.4 The Customer shall have the right to inspect and test the Goods at any time before delivery.  
4.5 If following such inspection or testing the Customer considers that the Goods do not conform or are unlikely to comply with the Supplier’s undertakings at clause 31, the Customer shall inform the Supplier and the Supplier shall, at the Supplier’s cost, immediately take such remedial action as is necessary to ensure compliance.  
4.6 Notwithstanding any such inspection or testing, the Supplier shall remain fully responsible for the Goods and any such inspection or testing shall not reduce or otherwise affect the Supplier’s obligations under the Contract, and the Customer shall have the right, at the Supplier’s cost, to conduct further inspections and tests after the Supplier has carried out its remedial actions.

4.7 The Supplier shall not, without the prior consent in writing from the Customer, supply to any third party any goods or products that carry any branding, marks, designs, labels, artwork, chemical formulation or other intellectual property rights of or relating to the Customer.

### 5 Delivery

5.1 The Supplier shall ensure that:  
5.11 the Goods are properly packed and secured in such manner as to enable them to reach their destination in good condition;  
5.12 each delivery of the Goods is accompanied by a delivery note which shows the date of the Order, the Order number (if any), the type and quantity of the Goods (including the code number of the Goods, where applicable), special storage instructions (if any) and, if the Goods are being delivered by instalments, the outstanding balance of Goods remaining to be delivered; and  
5.13 if the Supplier requires the Customer to return any packaging material to the Supplier, that fact is clearly stated on the delivery note.  
Any such packaging material shall be returned to the Supplier at the cost of the Supplier.

5.2 The Supplier shall deliver the Goods:

5.21 on the date specified in the Order, or, if no such date is specified, within 28 days of the date of the Order or such other date as agreed in writing;  
5.2.2 to the Customer’s premises at Innovation House, Bakewell Road, Orton Southgate, Peterborough, United Kingdom PE2 6XU or such other location as is set out in the Order, or as instructed by the Customer prior to delivery (Delivery Location); and  
5.2.3 during the Customer’s normal business hours, or as instructed by the Customer.

5.3 Delivery of the Goods shall be completed on the completion of unloading the Goods at the Delivery Location.

5.4 If the Supplier:

5.41 delivers less than 100% of the quantity of Goods ordered, the Customer may reject the Goods; or  
5.4.2 delivers more than 100% of the quantity of Goods ordered, the Customer may at its discretion, keep or reject the Goods or the excess Goods, and any rejected Goods shall be returnable, or made available for collection by the Supplier, at the Supplier’s risk and expense. If the Supplier delivers more or less than the quantity of Goods ordered, and the Customer accepts the delivery, the Customer may request that a pro rata adjustment shall be made to the invoice for the Goods.

5.4 The Supplier shall not deliver the Goods in instalments without the Customer’s prior written consent. Where it is agreed that the Goods are to be delivered by instalments, they may be invoiced and paid for separately. However, failure by the Supplier to deliver any one instalment on time or at all or any defect in an instalment shall entitle the Customer to the remedies set out in clause 5.

5.5 The Supplier shall pay all duties, charges and taxes that may arise in connection with the export or import of the Goods to the Customer, except that any UK import duty or UK import value added tax shall be payable by the Customer. The Supplier shall ensure that they obtain and hold all licences and consents required to export or import the Goods and deliver the same to the Delivery Location.

### 6 Remedies

61 If the Goods are not delivered on the date they are due as referred to in clause 4.2(a), or do not comply with the undertakings set out in clause 31, then, without limiting any of its other rights or remedies, the Customer shall have the right to any one or more of the following remedies, whether or not it has accepted the Goods:

6.11 to terminate the Contract;  
6.12 to reject the Goods (in whole or in part) and return them to, or make them available for collection by, the Supplier at the Supplier’s own risk and expense;  
6.13 to require the Supplier to repair or replace the rejected Goods, or to provide a full refund of the price of the rejected Goods;  
6.14 to refuse to accept any subsequent delivery of the Goods which the Supplier attempts to make;  
6.15 to recover from the Supplier any costs incurred by the Customer in obtaining substitute goods from a third party; and  
6.16 to claim damages for any other costs, liabilities, loss or expenses incurred by the Customer which are in any way attributable to the Supplier’s failure to carry out its obligations under the Contract or the Goods failing to comply with the undertakings set out in clause 31.

6.2 If the Goods are not delivered on the due date the Customer may at its option claim or deduct 10 per cent of the price of the Goods for

each week’s delay in delivery by way of liquidated damages, up to a maximum of 50 per cent of the total price of the Goods. If the Customer exercises its rights under this clause 5.2, it shall not be entitled to any of the remedies set out in clause 5.1 in respect of the Goods’ late delivery (but such remedies shall be available in respect of the Goods’ condition).

6.3 These Conditions shall apply to any repaired or replacement Goods supplied by the Supplier.

6.4 The Supplier shall keep the Customer indemnified in full against all costs, expenses, damages and losses (whether direct or indirect), including any interest, penalties, and legal and other professional fees and expenses awarded against or incurred or paid by the Customer as a result of or in connection with:

6.4.1 any claim made against the Customer for actual or alleged infringement of a third party’s intellectual property rights arising out of, or in connection with, the supply or use of the Goods, to the extent that the claim is attributable to the acts or omissions of the Supplier, its employees, agents or subcontractors;  
6.4.2 any claim made against the Customer by a third party arising out of, or in connection with, the supply of the Goods, to the extent that such claim arises out of the breach, negligent performance or failure or delay in performance of the Contract by the Supplier, its employees, agents or subcontractors or to the extent such claim arises out of the Goods failing to comply with the undertakings set out in clause 31; and  
6.4.3 any claim made against the Customer by a third party for death, personal injury or damage to property arising out of, or in connection with, defects in Goods, to the extent that the defect in the Goods is attributable to the acts or omissions of the Supplier, its employees, agents or subcontractors.

6.5 Clause 5.4 shall survive termination of the Contract.

6.6 The Customer’s rights and remedies under these Conditions are in addition to its rights and remedies implied by statute and common law.

### 7 Title and risk

71 Title and risk in the Goods shall pass to the Customer on completion of delivery.

### 8 Price and payment

81 The price of the Goods shall be the price set out in the Order, or, if no price is quoted, the price set out in the Supplier’s published price list in force as at the date the Contract came into existence.

8.2 Unless otherwise agreed in writing, the price of the Goods is exclusive of amounts in respect of value added tax (VAT), insurance and

carriage of the Goods, but includes the costs of packaging. No extra charges shall be effective unless agreed in writing and signed by the Customer.

8.3 The Customer shall, on receipt of a valid VAT invoice from the Supplier, pay to the Supplier such additional amounts in respect of VAT as are chargeable on the supply of the Goods.

8.4 The Supplier may invoice the Customer for the Goods on or at any time after the completion of delivery.

8.5 The Customer shall pay correctly rendered invoices by the end of the month following the month in which the Goods or the invoice in respect of them, whichever is the later, is received by the Customer, or within such other period as the parties agree in writing. Payment shall be made to the bank account nominated in writing by the Supplier.

8.6 If a party fails to make any payment due to the other under the Contract by the due date for payment (due date), then the defaulting party shall pay interest on the overdue amount at the rate of 5% per annum above Lloyds Bank plc’s base rate from time to time. Such interest shall accrue on a daily basis from the due date until the date of actual payment of the overdue amount, whether before or after judgment. The defaulting party shall pay the interest together with the overdue amount. This clause shall not apply to payments the defaulting party disputes in good faith.

8.7 The Customer may, without limiting any other rights or remedies it may have, set off any amount owed to it by the Supplier against any amounts payable by it to the Supplier under the Contract.

### 9 Customer property

91 The Supplier acknowledges that all materials, equipment and tools, drawings, Specifications, and data supplied by the Customer to the Supplier (Customer Materials) and all rights in the Customer material are and shall remain the exclusive property of the Customer. The Supplier shall keep the Customer Materials in safe custody at its own risk, maintain them in good condition until returned to the Customer, and not dispose or use the same other than in accordance with the Customer’s written instructions or authorisation.

### 10 Insurance

101 During the term of the Contract and for a period of 5 years thereafter, the Supplier shall maintain in force, with a reputable insurance company, professional indemnity insurance, product liability insurance and public liability insurance to cover such heads of liability as may arise under or in connection with the Contract, and shall, on the Customer’s request, produce both the insurance certificate giving details of cover and the receipt for the current year’s premium in respect of each insurance.

### 11 Confidential information

111 A party (receiving party) shall keep in strict confidence all technical or commercial know-how, Specifications, inventions, processes or initiatives which are disclosed to the receiving party by the other party (disclosing party), its employees, agents or subcontractors, and any other confidential information concerning the disclosing party’s business, its products, customers, contacts or its services which the receiving party may obtain. The receiving party shall only disclose such confidential information to those of its employees, agents or subcontractors who need to know the same for the purpose of discharging the receiving party’s obligations under the Contract, and shall ensure that such employees, agents or subcontractors shall keep such information confidential.

### 12 Non-solicitation

121 The Supplier shall not, directly or indirectly or on behalf of any other person, without the prior consent in writing from the Customer, approach any agent, contact, customer, supplier or client of the Customer.  
12.2 The Supplier shall not, directly or indirectly or on behalf of any other person, during the term of this Contract and for a period of 36 months thereafter, endeavour to entice away from the Customer or solicit any person, firm or company who, during the term of the Contract or during the 24 months before the entry into of this Contract, shall have been doing business with the Customer.

### 13 Intellectual property

131 In the event that any Goods have been jointly designed, developed and/or produced by the Supplier and the Customer, or in the event that any Goods have been designed, developed and/or produced by the Supplier at the request of the Customer, the Supplier assigns to the Customer, with full title guarantee and free from all third party rights, the Intellectual Property Rights and all other rights in such Goods and the Supplier shall, promptly at the Customer’s request, do (or procure to be done) all such further acts and things and the execution of all such other documents as the Customer may from time to time require for the purpose of securing for the Customer the full benefit all right, title and interest in and to the Intellectual Property Rights and all other rights so assigned to the Customer, including without limitation obtaining waivers of any moral rights in such Goods to which any person is now or may be at any future time entitled.

### 14 Termination

141 The Customer may terminate the Contract in whole or in part at any time before delivery with immediate effect by giving the Supplier written notice, whereupon the Supplier shall discontinue all work on the Contract. The Customer shall pay the Supplier fair and reasonable compensation for work-in-progress at the time of termination, but such compensation shall not include loss of anticipated profits or any consequential loss.

14.2 The Customer may terminate the Contract with immediate effect by giving written notice to the Supplier if the Supplier becomes subject to any of the following events:

14.3 the Supplier suspends, or threatens to suspend, payment of its debts, or is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or admits inability to pay its debts, or (being a company) is deemed unable to pay its debts within the meaning of section 123 of the Insolvency Act 1986, or (being an individual) is deemed either unable to pay its debts or as having no reasonable prospect of so doing, in either case, within the meaning of section 268 of the Insolvency Act 1986, or (being a partnership) has any partner to whom any of the foregoing apply;  
14.4 the Supplier commences negotiations with all or any class of its creditors with a view to rescheduling any of its debts, or makes a proposal for or enters into any compromise or arrangement with its creditors;

14.5 (being a company) a petition is filed, a notice is given, a resolution is passed, or an order is made, for or in connection with the winding up of the Supplier, other than for the sole purpose of a scheme for a solvent amalgamation of the Supplier with one or more other companies or the solvent reconstruction of the Supplier;

14.6 (being an individual) the Supplier is the subject of a bankruptcy petition or order;

14.7 a creditor or encumbrancer of the Supplier attaches or takes possession of, or a distress, execution, sequestration or other such process is levied or enforced on or sued against, the whole or any part of its assets and such attachment or process is not discharged within 14 days;

14.8 (being a company) an application is made to court, or an order is made, for the appointment of an administrator or if a notice of intention to appoint an administrator is given or if an administrator is appointed over the Supplier;

14.9 (being a company) a floating charge holder over the Supplier’s assets has become entitled to appoint or has appointed an administrative receiver;

14.10 a person becomes entitled to appoint a receiver over the Supplier’s assets or a receiver is appointed over the Supplier’s assets;

14.11 any event occurs, or proceeding is taken, with respect to the Supplier in any jurisdiction to which it is subject that has an effect equivalent or similar to any of the events mentioned in clause 13.2(a) to clause 13.2(f) inclusive;

14.12 the Supplier suspends, or threatens to suspend, or ceases or threatens to cease to carry on, all or substantially the whole of its business;

14.13 the Supplier’s financial position deteriorates to such an extent that in the Customer’s opinion the Supplier’s capability to adequately fulfil its obligations under the Contract has been placed in jeopardy; or

14.14 (being an individual) the Supplier dies or, by reason of illness or incapacity (whether mental or physical), is incapable of managing his or her own affairs or becomes a patient under any mental health legislation.

14.15 Termination of the Contract, however arising, shall not affect any of the parties’ rights and remedies that have accrued as at termination. Clauses which expressly or by implication survive termination of the Contract shall continue in full force and effect.

### 15 Force majeure

151 Neither party shall be liable to the other for any delay or failure in performing its obligations under the Contract to the extent that such delay or failure is caused by an event or circumstance that is beyond the reasonable control of that party, and which by its nature could not have been foreseen by such party or, if it could have been foreseen, was unavoidable, provided that the Supplier shall use all reasonable endeavours to cure any such events or circumstances and resume performance under the Contract. If any events or circumstances prevent the Supplier from carrying out its obligations under the Contract for a continuous period of more than 10 Business Days, the Customer may terminate this Contract immediately by giving written notice to the Supplier.

### 16 Assignment and subcontracting

161 The Customer may at any time assign, transfer, charge, subcontract or deal in any other manner with any or all of its rights or obligations under the Contract.

16.2 The Supplier may not assign, transfer, charge, subcontract or deal in any other manner with any or all of its rights or obligations under the Contract without the Customer’s prior written consent.

### 17 Notices

171 Any notice or other communication given to a party under or in connection with the Contract shall be in writing, addressed to that party at its registered office (if it is a company) or its principal place of business (in any other case) or such other address as that party may have specified to the other party in writing in accordance with this clause, and shall be delivered personally, or sent by pre-paid first class post, recorded delivery, commercial courier or fax.

17.2 A notice or other communication shall be deemed to have been received, if delivered personally, when left at the address referred to in clause 15.2(a), if sent by pre-paid first class post or recorded delivery, at 9.00 am on the second Business Day after posting; if delivered by commercial courier, on the date and at the time that the courier’s delivery receipt is signed; or, if sent by fax, one Business Day after transmission.

17.3 The provisions of this clause shall not apply to the service of any proceedings or other documents in any legal action.

### 18 Severance

181 If any court or competent authority finds that any provision of the Contract (or part of any provision) is invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that provision or part-provision shall, to the extent required, be deemed to be deleted, and the validity and enforceability of the other provisions of the Contract shall not be affected.

18.2 If any invalid, unenforceable or illegal provision of the Contract would be valid, enforceable and legal if some part of it were deleted, the provision shall apply with the minimum modification necessary to make it legal, valid and enforceable.

### 19 Waiver

191 A waiver of any right or remedy under the Contract is only effective if given in writing and shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach or default. No failure or delay by a party to exercise any right or remedy provided under the Contract or by law shall constitute a waiver of that or any other right or remedy, nor shall it preclude or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy. No single or partial exercise of such right or remedy shall preclude or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.

### 20 Third party rights

201 A person who is not a party to the Contract shall not have any rights under or in connection with it.

### 21 Variation

211 Except as set out in these Conditions, any variation to the Contract, including the introduction of any additional terms and conditions, shall only be binding when agreed in writing and signed by the Customer.

### 22 Governing law and jurisdiction

221 The Contract, and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with it or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual/disputes or claims), shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, English law, and the parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales
